<p>..... and Embley Park in Hampshire for the winter.</p>	<p>Florence visited the sick people near where she lived.</p>	<p>Florence decided she wanted to be a nurse.</p>

A brief history of Florence Nightingale 1820 - 1910

<p>In 1851, Florence Nightingale trained to be a nurse in Germany.</p>	<p>Florence decided to go to the Crimean War to help in hospitals.</p>	<p>Florence had to take other nurses with her.</p>
<p>Florence went to Crimea and worked in dirty hospitals.</p>	<p>Florence was not allowed to help the doctors to begin with, but....</p>	<p>....the doctors realised they needed her help.</p>

<p>The first thing Florence did was clean the hospital.</p>	<p>The next thing she did was give the soldiers bed to sleep on.</p>	<p>Then she gave the soldiers good food. This helped them get better quicker.</p>
<p>The soldiers were pleased that Florence was there to help them get better.</p>	<p>They gave her a special name.</p> <p>They called her <i>The Lady With the Lamp.</i></p>	<p>At the end of the Crimean War, Florence returned to England.</p>

<p>This allowed her to start the first modern training school for nurses at St. Thomas Hospital in 1860.</p>	<p>Florence Nightingale became known as the <i>founder of modern nursing</i>.</p>	<p>Florence had worked so hard in the Crimea, Queen Victoria wanted to meet her.</p>
<p>Florence Nightingale continued working with nurses and in hospitals.</p>	<p>As she got older Florence nursed her family when they were sick.</p> <p>They called her <i>The Lady With the Lamp</i>.</p>	<p>In 1910 Florence became very ill and died. Florence is buried at St. Margaret's in East Wellow.</p>
